2.	On pages 50-51, Chapman quotes John 5:36-40, 45-47. How does he summarize Jesus's criticism of the Pharisees in this passage? What is the warning for Bible readers today?
3.	On page 53, Chapman says "every talk will be evangelistic." What does he mean by this statement? What does this mean for you when you anticipate that your audience will be full of believers?
4.	On pages 54-57, what three types of context does Chapman describe? Briefly describe each of these contexts.
5.	The title of chapter 4 is "What is the aim of evangelistic preaching?". What is the aim of evangelistic preaching? What types of responses should we expect people to make to evangelistic talks?

6.	How does the author define repentance near the bottom of page 65? How does he define faith in the middle of page 66?
7.	The last section of chapter 4 is titled "Repentance and faith – a way of life." What are the implications of this section for Bible-based talked directed toward believers?
